Counseling

- Counseling for adults and children
- Groups for adults and children
- A branch of the mobile team that serves a few different site locations.
- CCAC North and Allegheny, Hearth, Gateway North, Gateway Main, and Roots
 of Faith.

Legal Advocacy

- · Assist in both Magisterial Courts and with Temporary PFA's.
 - o In PFA Office, we help file TPFAs.
 - In the Magistrates, they explain the different options available when someone is listed as a victim on a DV case.

Economic Empowerment

- · A supportive service focused on finances and basic needs.
 - Can change locks, get security cameras
 - Can pay for first month's rent and security deposit
 - Can pay for moving costs
 - o Offers tangible assistance

PAWS for Empowerment

- Offers transitional housing services for victims of dv fleeing with their companion animals
- Provides emergency shelter for victims and their animals
- Provides stipends for veterinary care and other animal related tangible support

05

Rapid Rehousing

 First Intervention designed to help families and individuals move quickly out of homelessness and into permanent housing in the community.

06

Prevention Education

- Series of classroom presentations range from three to four sessions per grade level.
- Sessions primarily focus on discussing optimistic bias, selfrespect, the power of positivity, bullying, teen stress, the influence of media and stereotypes, healthy vs. unhealthy relationships, and becoming an upstander

07

Medical Advocacy

- Presents and trains hospital and medical staff on domestic violence, signs of dv and symptoms
- Medical Advocates try and create systems change in medical settings by training medical staff and meeting with administrators
- Respond to hospitals to meet with a DV survivor
