Recently \$100 million in funding for mental health services was approved to be distributed across Pennsylvania. This legislation has been over a year in the making and is now heading off to the Senate and then hopefully to the governor's desk for his signature. Last year these funds were approved, along with the formation of a commission to help allocate the money.

One of my top priorities as state representative is to help solve the mental health crisis facing many Pennsylvanians. I have taken an active approach by forming and working with the North Hills Mental Health and Substance Use Task Force.

Since its inception, the task force has worked to inform the public and reduce stigma that is often associated with mental health and substance use issues. Together with other community leaders we make real, positive change in our community.

The task force was started with the goal of improving the lives of those who are suffering with mental health or substance use issues and their families and friends.
